Eventually companies always need to look forward to stay competitive, capture market share, and be the first to innovate a new product or service (Mondy 2014, p.115). They see the need to diversify and increase variety of goods that are made or sold. Hereby the strategic management process is used to answer a central question in HR strategy planning: "How to develop a human resource strategic plan?"
